The word "Mashramani" means 'the celebration after hard work'. Parades, costume competitions, music, masquerade parties and dancing on the streets form an important feature of the event

**Phagwah**- Phagwah, the festival of colours, is an ode to the East Indian heritage. It is celebrated widely all across Guyana on the day of Indian festival, Holi, and people from all walks of life irrespective of race and religion take part in the celebrations, where people dress in white and shower each other with dry and wet colours.

**Guyana Carnival**- Guyana Carnival is an annual feature takes place from 20th to 27th May every year. It includes various activities during the week including a parade on 26th May,

**Easter** – kite festival- Due to a substantial Christian population, Easter is celebrated with great fervour in Guyana. Guyanese have a tradition of raising all colours and types of kites in the air during this period at the seawall and local beaches.

**Diwali Motorcade**- On the occasion of Diwali, GHDS organizes every year a motorcade. This beautifully decorated floats depicting various aspects of the festival travel from various parts of the city and meet at a community grounds. The event will be concluded with stage performances by noted local dancers and singers. Around 10000 people attend the event

**Kala Utsav-** It is an annual event conceived as an innovative way to propagate and preserve Indian art form. The annual event features youth showcasing their talents under the categories of Ramayan chanting, male and female singing, duet singing, classical dance, folk dance, Tassa and instrumental music.

**Naya Zamana**- It is an annual cultural stage show organized by Guyana Hindu Dharmic Sabha to promote various forms of dance styles. It is one of the popular annual shows.
